Introduction

On the 7th of June 2020, Sunday, Luangdimai Citizens Forum (LCF) launched its “**Luangdilata Commission**” online via Zoom video conference. Due to the country being on lockdown with the arrival of COVID-19 crisis, mobility has been greatly restricted, disabling LCF the opportunity to organize for the same in a physical space.

The online programme was attended by a total of 46 members of the Luangdimai community. The list of the participating members is attached as Annex-1 and the program schedule as Annex-2.

Background

In the year 2012, the “Zeliangrong Language Commission” was constituted by the All Zeliangrong Students Union (Assam, Manipur, and Nagaland) as a way to bridge the dialectal variations and socio-psychological barrier existing amongst the four tribes (Zeme, Inpui, Liangmai, Ruangmei) of the Luangdimai people. In the same year, the “Zeliangrong Language Commission” was endorsed by the Zeliangrong Baudi (Assam, Manipur, and Nagaland). Accordingly, in 2015 the first book “Zeliangrong Lat” was released by the Commission.

In a Dimki of LCF held in Shillong, Meghalaya, on the 5th August 2017, the forum resolved to Promote and Popularize the existing work of the first Commission because of the recognition that the ancestry, history, kinship and socio-cultural entity of Luangdimai people can be enhanced once a common intelligible dialect/language is available. A mobile phone-based App “**Luangdilata App**” was launched at a Conclave held by LCF at Imphal on the 6th April 2018. The App was designed to

make learning **Luangdilal** easy to understand and accessible to all. A book on Luangdimai was also commissioned for publication from the papers which were presented at the conclave.

Encouraging the literary work to move on from ‘Zelianrong Lat’, the Language Primer and Luangdilal App, LCF in its Jalukie, Nagaland Dimki on the 23rd November 2018, resolved to form a new “**Luangdilal Commission**” and will work to create, preserve, and promote the Luangdimai language. LCF has resolved to call this language as **LUANGDILAT**, meaning, “*the language of the Luangdimai people*”. The word Luangdimai is derived from MAKUILUANGDI, the legendary village where people spoke one language before using the dialectal terms Zeme, Inpui, Ruangmei and Liangmai as their identity markers.

Summary of Programme

The Programme started with the Chairperson, Ms. Lanbangliu Lulu Kamei, Joint Secretary, LCF welcoming all the members present for the online Launching programme of the Luangdilal Commission.

1. Keynote Address: Mr. Dai Remmei, Member, Elders Board, LCF

Mr. Dai Remmei is one of the founding members of the Luangdimai Citizens Forum, which was earlier known as the Zelianrong Citizens Forum which was started from Facebook Group. Since its inception, Mr. Remmei has contributed and participated actively in all the initiatives of LCF. Apart from his work with LCF and his professional accomplishment over the years, Mr. Remmei currently works with the Ministry of Labour and Employment, Govt. of India, as Additional Central Provident Fund Commission, and is based in Mumbai.

In his keynote address, Mr. Remmei focused on the following points:

- Our language which was once spoken for over 2000 years has evolved, diversified, changed slightly into different dialects in terms of pronunciations, acquired and adapted a few words from neighboring villages but in the process, this enriched the vocabularies, at the same time it has also created a bigger gap from one village to another and from one region to another.
- Why the need for a Luangdilal Language? Mr. Dai emphasized on the importance of a common language if we are to survive and thrive as a one people group. He shared his experience of his first visit to the NC hills in the year 2002, where he was filled with much excitement to meet and communicate with elders and people from various villages. However, the realization that he was unable to communicate effectively in a language that was understood by them left him feeling grieved.

- Mr. Remmei shared that a common language gives us a common understanding, helps us in communicating the precise meaning of what we want to convey and can exactly know what is to be expected out of it; It gives us a sense of oneness and solidarity which in turn builds stronger relationships with one another; It gives us a sense of identity, creates a sense of belonging and acceptance within the group which then allows people to exercise trust, reliability and productivity.
- Unity is Strength but unity starts when we speak the same/common language.
- First, we shape our language then our language shapes us.
- It was strongly stated by Mr. Remmei, that the **Luangdilal Commission** is not creating a new language but instead re-discovering, recognizing and promoting our Ancestor's language which was spoken a few thousand years ago. The same language that has helped our ancestor to prosper during the era of the Makuiluangdi Civilization.
- Gratitude was extended to the All Zelianrong Students Union (AMN) and the Zelianrong Baudi (AMN) for taking up the first work of bringing a common language for Luangdimai, earlier called Zelianronglat which was first printed in 2015 and widely circulated.
- Mr. Remmei ended his keynote address by encouraging and appealing to all Luangdimai to feel the great need to unite and support this initiative of building a new era of Luangdimai Civilization.

2. **Introduction of the Members of the Luangdilal Commission: Mr. Lummei Kamson, Convenor, LCF**

Mr. Lummei Kamson has been associated with LCF from the very beginning. He was earlier its former General Secretary as well as Convenor. In the year 2012 and 2014, the Zelianrong Ancestral Tour was organized, and Mr. Lummei was one of the individuals to have led this initiative from the very beginning to the end. Apart from his work with LCF, Mr. Lummei works as Manager for the National Aluminium Company, Odisha.

For this part of the programme, Mr. Lummei gave a detailed introduction of the newly appointed members of the **“LUANGDILAL COMMISSION”** by Luangdimai Citizens Forum (LCF) as follows:

He also said that Luangdimai people are fortunate to have many distinguished personalities ready to sacrifice for the betterment of our people. He said he was more than happy to introduce all the members of the commission to the participants.

i. Chairman Dr. Elungkiebe Zeliang

Rev. Dr. Elungkiebe is the former Chairman of the Zeliangrong Language Commission Formed in 2012 by AZSU (AMN) and ZB (AMN). He was instrumental in founding and shaping the Zeliangrong Theological Forum (later called as Luangdimai Theological Forum) in Eastern Theological College, Jorhat while he was serving there. He shaped and guided many of our Luangdimai theologians in the college.

Presently, Dr. Elungkiebe is a Professor & HOD of Christian Studies & Peace Initiatives, Martin Luther Christian University, Shillong. He had written numerous articles, books and gave lectures in leading conferences, seminars across NEI and elsewhere. His notable books are: *Charismatic movements in the Baptist churches in North East India : a Zeliangrong Perspective*, *Pioneer*

missionaries of North East India : Selected Missionaries, A History of the Manipur Baptist Convention, etc.

Soft spoken yet full of zeal for our people, it is fortunate to have Rev Dr. Elungkiebe again as Chairman. Kellum.

ii. Vice Chairman: Aaron Pamei

Mr. Aaron Pamei is a Director, Naval Headquarter, Ministry of Defense, New Delhi. He came into Indian Civil Services since 1996. Since then Mr. Aaron has been and is an important Luangdimai leader and elder based in New Delhi who tirelessly works for our people through thick and thin. Mr. Aaron was also the Member of Zeliangrong Language Commission 2012

Mr. Aaron is Professional an Ultra Marathon runner. He had participated in scores of International events, National and Metros organized by Corporates and others and brought home laurels and medals.

Despite official engagements and tight schedule, our respected brother who is also multi-linguist has agreed to put effort for our Luangdimai people. LCF and Luangdimai fraternity is fortunate to have him again in the Luangdilal Commission. Kellum.

3. Act of Declaration of Luangdilal Commission and Speech: Dr. Samuel Pamei, Chairman, Elders Board, LCF

Dr. Samuel Pamei is one of the most enthusiastic supporters of LCF and on many occasions, he has opened up his home and his heart to accommodate the needs and demands of various LCF initiatives. He continues to play an active role in LCF work and acts as Mentor to the LCF Executive Team. Outside of LCF, Dr. Samuel Pamei, is a Consultant Radiologist in Supercare Hospital, Shillong Meghalaya, and is also an Entrepreneur.

For the Act of Declaration of Luangdilal Commission, Dr. Samuel Pamei stated that *“Language is intrinsic to the expression of culture. It is a means of communicating values, beliefs and customs. It has an important social function in fostering feelings of ethnic identity and building solidarity. It is a means by which culture, traditions and shared values may be conveyed and preserved. It is the most potent means of binding our community together which is unfortunately lacking in our society. It has stretched out linguistic seams to a breaking point. In order to address this issue, LCF has embarked on promoting Luangdilal, a common dialect which is easy and acceptable to all, under the leadership of the Luangdilal Commission. So, following careful consideration and adequate deliberation over a period of time, the LCF search committee have considered the following seven members for the “Luangdilal Commission”. All seven of you have been formally mandated to be a member of the Luangdilal Commission on this day. The 7th of June 2020. We congratulate you dear members and thank you for your acceptance. May God the Almighty grant you wisdom, unity and fortitude as you*

embark on this noble and onerous responsibility. Your effort will be a lasting legacy in the history of the Luangdilat and Luangdimai people, remembered and revered for ages to come. God Bless you and thank you. Luangdimai Wiye. Luangdimai Wichange. Kellum.”

4. **Words of Encouragement: Mr. Elu Ndong, Former Advisor, LCF and Mr. Mathiupuang Gonmei, Former Advisor, LCF**

• **Mr. Elu Ndong, Former Advisor, LCF**

Mr. Elu Ndong is at present the General Secretary of the Naga Hoho and is based in Nagaland. He has in the past worked as Former General Secretary and Vice President of the NSF (Naga Student's Federation); Former Organizing Secretary, North East Students Organization (NESO); Former General Secretary, Zeliangrong Baudi (Assam, Manipur, Nagaland); and Former Assembly Secretary, Naga Hoho.

Mr. Elu Ndong emphasized on the following points:

- He shared that major Naga tribes like that of the Ao, Sema, Angami, Tangkhul, and Konyak, despite having different dialects, the level of unity shared by these tribes is great. They have a common language and common literature, and it is because of this commonality of language that binds them to unite and develop as a society.
- Taking the example of Nagaland, tribes like the Ao's, Lotha's and the Angami's, at the University level, have introduced their dialects/languages as a Degree and Master's course. When we look at our society, we lack behind tremendously. It is because of this variation in our dialect/language, that there is lack of unity, understanding and coordination among the Luangdimai people.
- He encouraged the group by re-instating that the Luangdimai society have many intellectuals who can contribute as much and, in many situations, much more, than other tribes. But the difficulty lies in this simple fact that because of lack of a common language, we are unable to truly unite and address issues that are of common interest.
- He asserted that rather than divide, our Luangdimai people must learn to keep our differences aside and instead come together, have a dialogue and work in developing our people and our society as a whole.
- Mr. Elu Ndong voiced out his hope that with the launching of this Commission, the Commission and the Luangdimai people can realise this goal of "One people, with one vision, with one voice". He also shared that in the process of taking up this task and responsibility, there

will be many challenges, but despite the odds that are to take place in the near future, this Commission will have the support of its people and will overcome and bring about new heights for the Luangdimai family.

- **Mr. Mathiupuang Gonmei, Former Advisor, LCF**

A Social Worker by profession, Mr. Mathiupuang Gonmei, has been associated with the initiatives of LCF since its inception. In the past, he has worked as Assistant Registrar, IGNOU, New Delhi; Senior Protocol Executive, Lok Sabha Secretariat Parliament of India; Chairman, All India Organizing Committee of Rani Birth Centenary cum Indigenous Cultural Festival (2015-2016); Chairman, Naga Students' Union Delhi, Action Committee (2007-2008); Advisor, NSUD (2004-2005); Chairman, NSUD, Constitution Drafting Committee (2002-2003); Convenor, All Tribal Students' Action Committee, Manipur (1992-1993).

Mr. Mathiupuang Gonmei emphasized on the following points:

- Talking about the rationale behind the inception of the Luangdilang Commission, Mr. Gonmei shared that over the past years, there have been incidents where some critics are of the view that the absence of commonality in language amongst the variants i.e Zeme, Inpui, Liangmai and Ruangmei, is reason for each to be considered as a different and an independent tribe. The Luangdimai people have also shared their opinion of their difficulty because of the lack of a common language. Mr. Gonmei has re-established in his speech today that the history of the Luangdimai people and our ancestors, originates from one place, one village, one culture, one language, and one clan. He encouraged us to free ourselves from this thinking that divides us and instead start somewhere and somehow. It was from this understanding of the challenges at the ground, that the idea of forming a Zeliangrong Language Commission was born.
- He applauded LCF for taking the onus of moving this Luangdilang initiative forward, and though we have a long way to go, he is positive that if we continue to be steadfast and determined, in over a decade, our people will be communicating in the Luangdilang.
- He also congratulated the new members appointed to the commission and shared the knowledge that the enemy within is more powerful than the enemy without. He reprises the seriousness for the need to fulfil this vision for our people and encourages the Commission members to involve in the future activities of the commission more women. He stated the fact that women constitute half the population and hence must have the platform as equally as men to actively decide and implement initiatives or activities that are for the good of the people. The active involvement and engagement of youths from the start of the Commission's work is also

crucial. They are our future leaders and messengers of this vision and must be well informed if they are to lead our people to unite, grow and sustain as one.

- Besides developing a Luangdilal Dictionary and Thesaurus, Mr. Gonmei shared the need and the importance of developing a “working language” that can be shared via workshops and trainings or incorporated in school syllabus across Assam, Manipur and Nagaland in the near future. For implementing the outcome and future good works of the Commission at the ground level, Mr. Gonmei urges the Commission to seek the support of as many Learned Individuals, Groups, Civil organizations etc.
- Mr. Gonmei is happy this Zoom meeting is a reality and he also request the LCF team to organize and conduct similar meetings once in a month/once in two months, to address or discuss any topic or issue concerning the welfare of the Luangdimai family. He gives his very best wishes to the Luangdimai Commission and to LCF on this new journey.

5. Time for zoom members to share or inquire:

- **Mr. Johnny Asin Ruangmei**, OSD to Govt of Nagaland congratulated the Commission members and the good works of LCF. He also volunteered to support the Luangdilal Commission’s work with a contribution of Rupees Fifty Thousand (Rs.50,000).
- **Ms. Achinglu Kamei**, Assistant Professor, DU, thanked LCF for all the hard work over the past years. She stated that LCF unlike many other conservative organizations and civil bodies is a progressive entity and have encouraged and supported the involvement of women in its initiatives. She further went on to share that because our society is a Patriarchal Society, women have been taught to be subservient and hence do not always feel confident or free to voice out their perspectives on important issues even when platforms and opportunities are available. She encourages LCF to give a nudge to the womenfolk in the future.

6. Speech from Chairman, Luangdilal Commission: Dr. Elungkiebe Zeliang

A Man of Faith, an Intellect, a Writer, a Professor and a constant source of encouragement for the young, our newly appointed Chairman, Dr. Elungkiebe Zeliang said *“On behalf of Luangdilal Commission, I would like to express our heartfelt thanks to the Leaders of LCF for trusting us and appointing us as members of the Luangdilal Commission. In the first Zeliangrong Commission, which was appointed by the Zeliangrong Baudi (AMN) and the All Zeliangrong Students Union (AMN) in*

2013, there were 5 members in which 3 of us were active members. This time LCF has enlarged the commission and we have seven members. Apart from Achai Aaron Pamei and I, the other five members are new. Welcome to all the new members to our commission. I look forward to working with you in this important Luangdilut project. We all know that Zeliangrong is blessed with four or five variant dialects, what we call today as Zeme, Liangmai, Rongmei and Inpui. Despite our common ancestry and common history and tradition, linguistic variations have always been a problem for our community as several of our former speakers have already mentioned. Therefore, creating a common language for our people is imperative for the unity and welfare of all Luangdimai people in North East India. Many people are pessimistic about it but there are also people who are optimistic about our project. We know that from Latin, five modern national languages, namely Italian, French, Spanish, Portuguese and Romanian developed. Of the five languages, Italian is the closest to the classical Latin. Likewise, from the classical Makuiluangdi language, today, we have four dialects or languages. We may even say five dialects if we treat Northern Zeme and Southern Zeme as a different language. A close comparative study of the Luangdimai dialect show that the present Lianglat, Liangmai is the closest to the classical Luangdilut, just like the present Italian is closest to classical Latin. Lianglat is also found to be the middle language for which we heavily follow the present Lianglat in developing our Luangdilut. As we work on Luangdilut, we keep in mind that all the four, five dialects that we have and speak today are all Luangdilut and are varieties of our Luangdimai/Zeliangrong language and so we try to add words from these dialects or languages as well. We know that Hebrew language was not spoken for nearly two thousand years. It was only in the 19th century that some Jews began to work on it and today it has become the national language for the state of Israel. If Luangdimai people have the will, it is not at all difficult for us to develop a common language for us. We believe that Luangdimai are one people and we once had a common language. Today we are going to re-create our common language for ourselves and also for our future generations. Brother Mathiupuang has mentioned the way forward. Even after working on dictionary or other text books, if it is not introduced to our people, to our schools and to our young people, our work will be a waste of time, money and energy. Therefore, on behalf of the Language commission, I would request LCF and also our Luangdimai/Zeliangrong Civil Societies to plan on how to execute and also how to disseminate what we have done and how to quickly spread and popularize our Luangdilut so that in a few years' time, we will not be using English but we will be using our own common language in our common platforms. Once again, on behalf of the Luangdilut Commission, I assure you that we will do our best. We request all of you to give your continuous support to us. Thank You. Kellum."

7. Prayer/Kellum: Pastor Zilliang Pamei, Member, Elders Board, LCF

Pastor is at present serving as Pastor at Town Baptist Church, Haflong, Assam.

In the language of Zeme, Liangmai and Ruangmei, Pastor invoked a prayer of blessing for each and every member of the Luangdilut Commission and the work they are to take forward.

8. Vote of Thanks: Ms. Lanbangliu Lulu Kamei, Joint Secretary, LCF (Chairperson)

The program ended with a vote of thanks from the Chairperson. Time was also taken to applaud the success of the programme.

Points of Action/ Way Forward

- Develop Working Language of Luangdilut
- Develop Luangdilut syllabus to incorporate at the School level
- Subscribe to Zoom account to prevent disconnection of future meetings
- Organize and conduct future online Zoom meetings once a month/once in two months, to address/discuss issues concerning Luangdimai people

Conclusion

The programme concluded on a positive note. Many important and crucial history, perspectives, ideas and questions were raised and discussed. The program despite being an online programme saw the attendance of a good number of Luangdimai people. Many also had the opportunity to meet and to place a name to a face for the first time. The LCF team is filled with gratitude for the enormous love and support received.
